## The 1st Meeting of the RED CIBA and ISAE South West Europe Region

The Organising Committee invites submission of abstracts for short oral presentations or posters which fall in the field of applied animal behaviour and welfare science for the first meeting of the Red CIBA and ISAE South West Europe (SWE) region.

RED CIBA is a recently created network for Spanish animal welfare researchers. The main objectives of the organisation are to actively promote communication, discussion and collaboration between animal welfare researchers in Spain; to share progress in the works done in the field of animal welfare science in Spain; to facilitate communication with non-scientific, social agents, and to promote activities aiming to the establishment/strengthening of links among Spanish animal welfare researchers. ISAE, the International Society of Applied Ethology, aims at covering all applied aspects and behavioural sciences relevant to human-animal interactions such as farming, wildlife management, keeping of companion and laboratory animals, and control of pests. The society now has an international, federal structure, as well as regional representatives around the world. The representative region in this Joint Meeting is the ISAE SWE region, which includes France, Italy, Portugal and Spain. The meeting will take place in the Faculty of Veterinary of the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB), Bellaterra (Barcelona), from 14th (13:00h) to 15th July, 2022. All presentations will have to be done in person at the meeting, but attendance to the presentations will also be available in streaming for those not presenting.

A preliminary program of the joint meeting is attached in another document. Please take into account that the joint meeting will include also the following **2 Keynote lectures:** 

- -Animal Welfare under the One Welfare context
- -Behaviour as indicator of positive emotions and welfare

Additionally, two workshops will be organised on the 14th July afternoon.

**Abstracts for oral and poster presentations on** behavioural sciences and animal welfare in farming species, wildlife, companion and laboratory animals are accepted. Abstracts can be either presenting a scientific work or a more theoretical approach, including education on animal welfare and behaviour.

## Guide for authors

Except for theoretical contributions and some workshop contributions, abstracts should include a statement of purpose, methods used, results (including data and brief statistics), and conclusions. See the ISAE Guidelines Appendices II and III, for more information <u>click here</u>, particularly regarding <u>the</u> ethical use of animals.

Abstracts must follow the layout of the template provided in an additional document.

Abstracts must not exceed **400 words** excluding title, names, and affiliation. Abstracts must be written in English. It is the authors' responsibility to ensure that the abstract is clearly written.

The presenting author should be indicated. Be aware that if this presenting author does not register in time, your contribution will be removed from the program. A maximum of two abstracts per presenting author will be accepted. It will be possible to attend/listen to presentations by streaming, but not to present an oral or poster communication online.

Oral presentations will last from 10 to 15 minutes (depending on number of abstracts submitted). Slides of the presentations and posters should be in English, like abstracts. However, provided that one of the organisers (RED CIBA) is a Spanish network, using Spanish to explain the slides and posters will be allowed. The final program will be advertised if an oral presentation will be in Spanish.
