## Project: Early, Non-Invasive Detection of PRRS Virus in Swine

The Archer Lab in the Department of Animal Sciences at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign is seeking a motivated student interested in pursuing a M.S. degree as part of an interdisciplinary project focused on improving early detection of Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome virus (PRRSv) using volatile organic compounds, saliva chemistry, and behavioral monitoring. This thesis-based position offers a **unique opportunity** to work at the intersection of animal behavior, welfare, physiology, and disease diagnostics, with direct application to the U.S. pork industry.

# **Project Overview**

This project will investigate how chemical and behavioral indicators may predict an active infection before clinical signs appear. By integrating air and saliva volatile organic compound analyses with continuous behavioral monitoring, this research aims to define early diagnostic windows with potential to improve herd health management, welfare, and biosecurity.

#### **Key Responsibilities**

- Conduct behavioral observations and video analysis of weaned pigs in controlled trials
- Collect and analyze saliva and air samples for volatile organic compounds
- Assist with data processing, statistical modeling, and interpretation of results
- Collaborate with a multidisciplinary team spanning animal welfare, veterinary medicine, and diagnostic chemistry
- Contribute to outreach and publication of findings in scientific and producer-facing venues

- B.S. in Animal Sciences, Veterinary Medicine, or a closely related field
- Strong interest in swine behavior, health, and welfare
- Ability to work in a collaborative research environment
