<u>Criteria for undergraduate and graduate student competition (100 points total):</u>

1. Infographic Design: 35 points

- Traditional poster design (-35 points)
- Few or no full sentences (10 points)
- Good use of white/blank space, elements are not crowded (5 points)
- Visually appealing color scheme (5 points)
- Legible with large fonts and color contrast (5 points)
- Logical flow of ideas (5 points)
- Objective and take-home message is immediately evident (5 points)

2. Graphics: 20 points

- Creative use of visual aids that add meaning (5 points)
- High-quality, sharp visuals (5 points)
- Repetition of elements, including title formats, graphics, shapes (5 points)
- Easy to understand with minimal text (5 points)

3. Scientific content: 25 points

- Conclusion is valid and supported by data presented (10 points)
- Significance of subject matter is clear (5 points)
- No factual errors (5 points)
- Plain language no jargon or acronyms (5 points)

4. Presentation when judge visits student poster: 20 points

- Engaging prepared narration of 1-2 min (5 points)
- Succinct, clear answers to judge questions (5 points)
- Strong command of subject (5 points)
- Recognizes limits of study (5 points)

Bonus: catchy, clever, clear titles! The Triple C!
